That move shocked them just as the "First Shot Heard Round the World" back in 1775. Converse to what they expected, he stepped down and this is, basically, what he had to say to his troops near Princeton, NI, on 2 Nov 1783. He opened by summing up the prior eight years. It was a miracle that so many from diverse backgrounds, with differing opinions of the conditions which spawned the outcry for our cause of liberty could unite together as a disciplined army and instantly became but one patriotic Band of Brothers. He went on to say that these United States would be ever indebted to them for their sacrifice, which they long endured. He reminded them of their abilities and resourcefulness and encouraged them to transition those skills to harness the opportunities that lay ahead both at home and the movement west. He encouraged them not to dwell on the hardships and the dark hours that they experienced on the field but to build on the glorious victory, much like those of his fellow citizens towards effecting these great and valuable purposes on which our very existence as a nation so materially depend. He closed with a statement to all those who followed his lead from the general to the private. "May ample justice be done them here, and may the choicest of heaven's favors, both here and hereafter, attend those who, under the divine auspices, have secured innumerable blessings for others; with these wishes, and the benediction, the Commander in Chief is about to retire from service. The curtain of separating will soon be draw, and the military scene to him will be closed forever".
